Village Farm Circuit Banquet Nov. 27th

To be eligible for the 2010 Circuit Awards you must be a current client of the Village Farm (boarder or lesson student). Awards will be given to the competitors that gain the most accumulative points from the TVF show circuit during the 2010 show year. It is designed to recognize the top riders and horses being exhibited at the farm. Separate awards will be available for each division offered. The following rules will apply:

- Points will be accumulate for each horse/rider combination.
- Each exhibitor in the program must be a current TVF client at the time of the Awards Banquet.
- All exhibitors must compete in at least 1 of the events of that circuit to be invited to the year end banquet.
- All points accumulated at each show will count toward these special awards.

Rules & Regulations

- ❖ All riders must wear ASTM/SEI headgear at all times while mounted, collared shirt and breeches. No jeans allowed.
- ❖ The Village Farm's decision is final.
- ❖ The Village Farm, its owners, managers, employees, will not be held responsible for any accident, illness or injury (including death), loss, or damage occurring at the show.
- ❖ All entry forms are to be completely filled out, signed and submitted with full payment.
- ❖ Entrants may FLAT in the show ring prior to show and between divisions.
- ❖ All dogs must be leashed while on show grounds.
- ❖ All entries and horses on grounds must pay \$11 office fee.
- ❖ Entries close the evening before the show at 6pm. Post entries will be accepted at a late fee of \$10. No scratch fees.
- ❖ \$50 fee for all non-negotiable checks.
- ❖ All prize money won will be awarded on the day of the show.
- ❖ All ties will remain tied.
- ❖ Seven ribbons awarded for each class. Champion and Reserve for each division.
- ❖ To be eligible for Circuit Awards, you need only compete in the home shows at the Village Farm. At least one class must be entered in order to receive an invitation to the banquet. No extra fees, but please participate in fund raising efforts.
- ❖ All five shows listed count toward the 2010 Circuit Awards.
- ❖ Ribbons to 10th place for Circuit Awards at the year end banquet on November 27th. All award winners must be present or send a representative in order to receive the award.
- ❖ All divisions will offer Circuit Championships.

Divisions and Classes

Grasshopper Division - Closed division, rider/horse combinations may not compete in any other division on day of show. Class 1 will require a test to be followed of basic flat exercises similar to that of a training level dressage test, scored mainly on execution, rhythm and straightness. Class 2 will have a course of poles to navigate at the walk or trot to be judged on straightness (getting the center of the pole), rubs, and maintaining the gait. No cantering allowed in class 2. Class No. 3 to be judged the same as the Style Division.

1. Walk/trot - Test A
2. Trotting Ground Poles
3. Low Cross Rails - Time

Hunter Style Division - Open to all. To be judged on style. Priority to no jumping faults, distances, etc. Horses manners or rhythm are not to be judged just the jump.

4. Round One - Cross Rails 8 jumps
5. Round Two - Verticles up to 2'
6. Round Three - Verticles/Oxers up to 2'6"

Puddle Jumper Division - Open to all. Fences up to 2'3"

7. Med Cross Rails - Time
8. High Cross Rails - P&S
9. Puddle Jumpers - JO

Itty Bitty Division - Open to all. Fences up to 2'6"

10. Itty Bitty Jumpers - Time
11. Itty Bitty Jumpers - P&S
12. Itty Bitty Jumpers - JO

Child/Adult Division - Open to all. Fences up to 3'3". The classic will pay back \$75 to the winner and \$10 for second place finisher. **Must have three horses entered to payback.** If no payback the entry fee will be normal rate.

TERM DEFINITIONS:

Time - Only 1 round to complete and that entire round will be timed.

P&S - (Power & Speed) The first 5 jumps will be considered the power phase, if those 6 jumps are clear, the rider continues directly to jumps 6 through 10. Jumps 6 through 10 will be the speed phase and will be timed.

JO - (Jump Off) The first round will consist of 10 jumps, if the rider is clear, they will move into the second round which is timed. Rider must wait for signal to start second round. Second round will consist of 5 jumps.
